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New Fiscal Year – Unit Tasks

Reminder all documents for Good Standing are to be submitted via Givebacks. There is no need to mail any documents to Wisconsin PTA.

*Transfer your books. Use a CPA or 3 non account signers to perform a Financial Review of your records for the Fiscal Year Ended 6/30/2024, then upload your signed <u>Financial Review Statement</u> into Givebacks by November 1st. (EXAMPLE of a <u>Completed Financial Review Statement</u>)

***Submit your 990.** You do not need to wait until the IRS November 15th deadline. Once your financial review is completed you can submit your 990 to the IRS. Most PTA's only need to file the <u>990N</u>. Take a screen shot of the filing and upload it in Givebacks.

*If you have not done so yet, go to the bank with the new board members and switch account signature responsibilities as necessary. Make sure the right people are signers on the bank account for the summer and incoming year. Make sure all IRS and PTA Guidelines regarding treasurer responsibilities and account signers are followed. You should have 2 non-related/not-in-the-same-household signers for your account.

*Transfer Stripe Account in Givebacks if you have a new treasurer Instructions for Stripe Transfer.

*Prepare Draft Budget and post it for 30 days for your members to read, then review in detail and motion to approve at your next meeting in the fall. Include funding for your board to attend the Wisconsin PTA Convention (April 5th), along with National PTA's Legislative Convention (March 3-6th) and virtual Annual Convention (June 25-28). Units should include funding to have one or more of your board members attend. Estimate the cost of registration to be \$75 per person for each event for use in your budget and motion to approve changes when actual costs are known. *Save the date for the 2024-2025 Wisconsin State PTA convention on Saturday, April 5th, 2025, in New Holstein. If you wish to be involved in the planning and receive free registration, please reach out.
